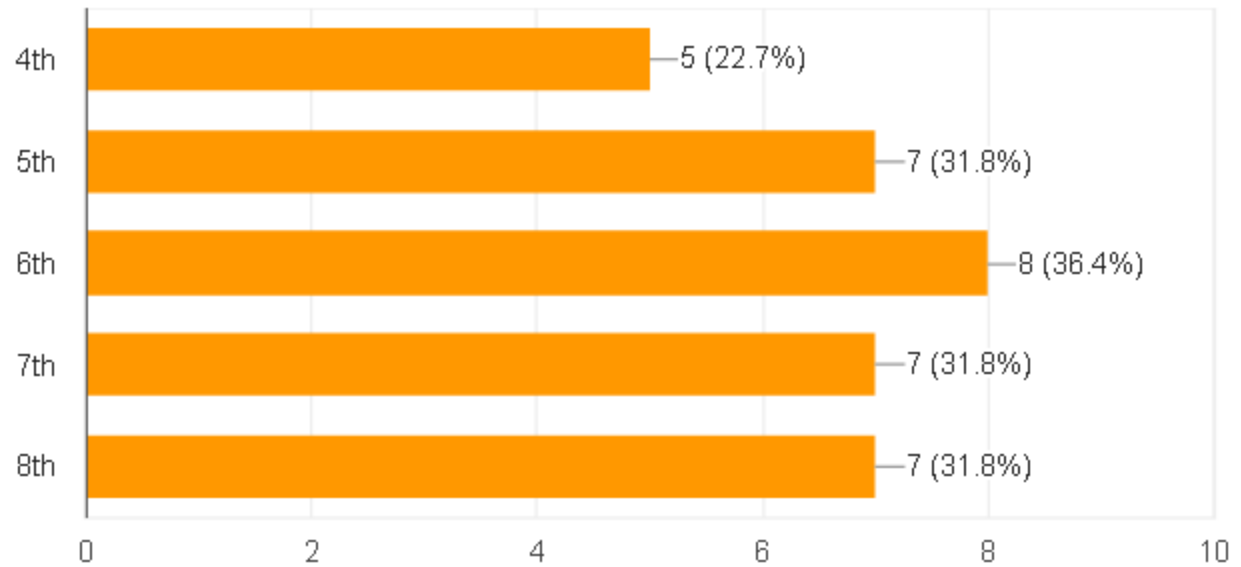


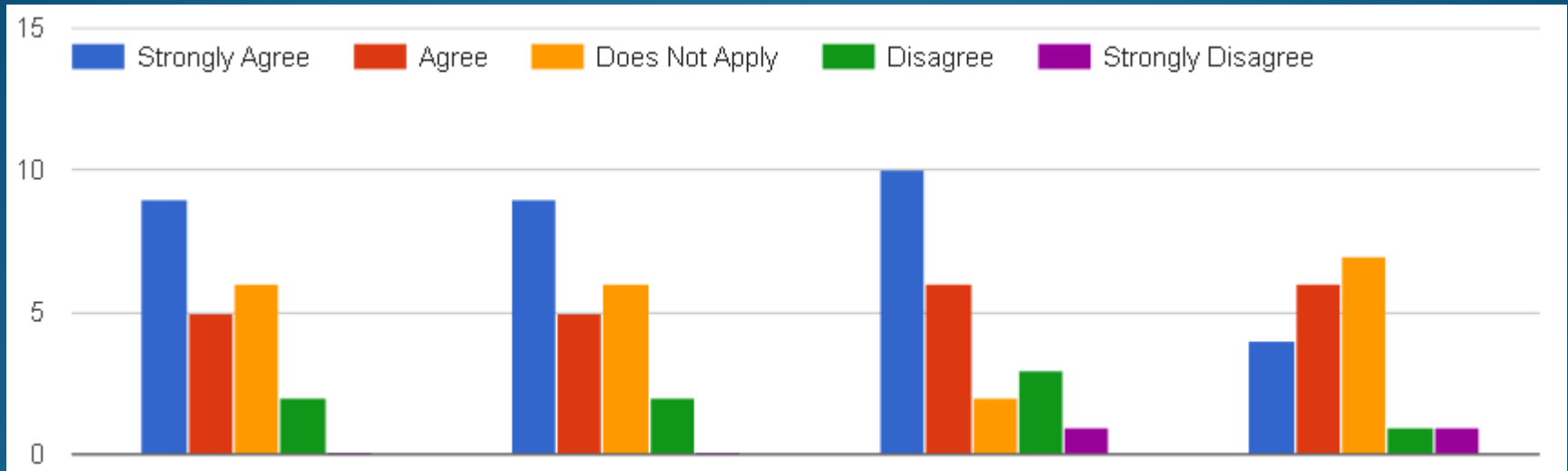

Multiple choice survey questions.



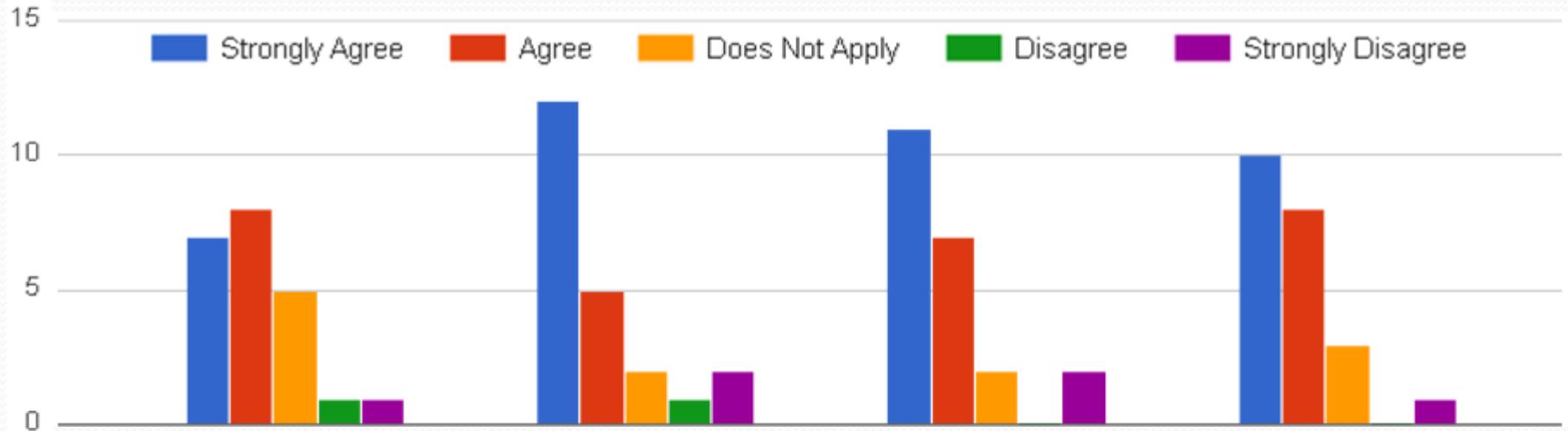
It is easier to organize homework assignments by posting them in Google classroom.

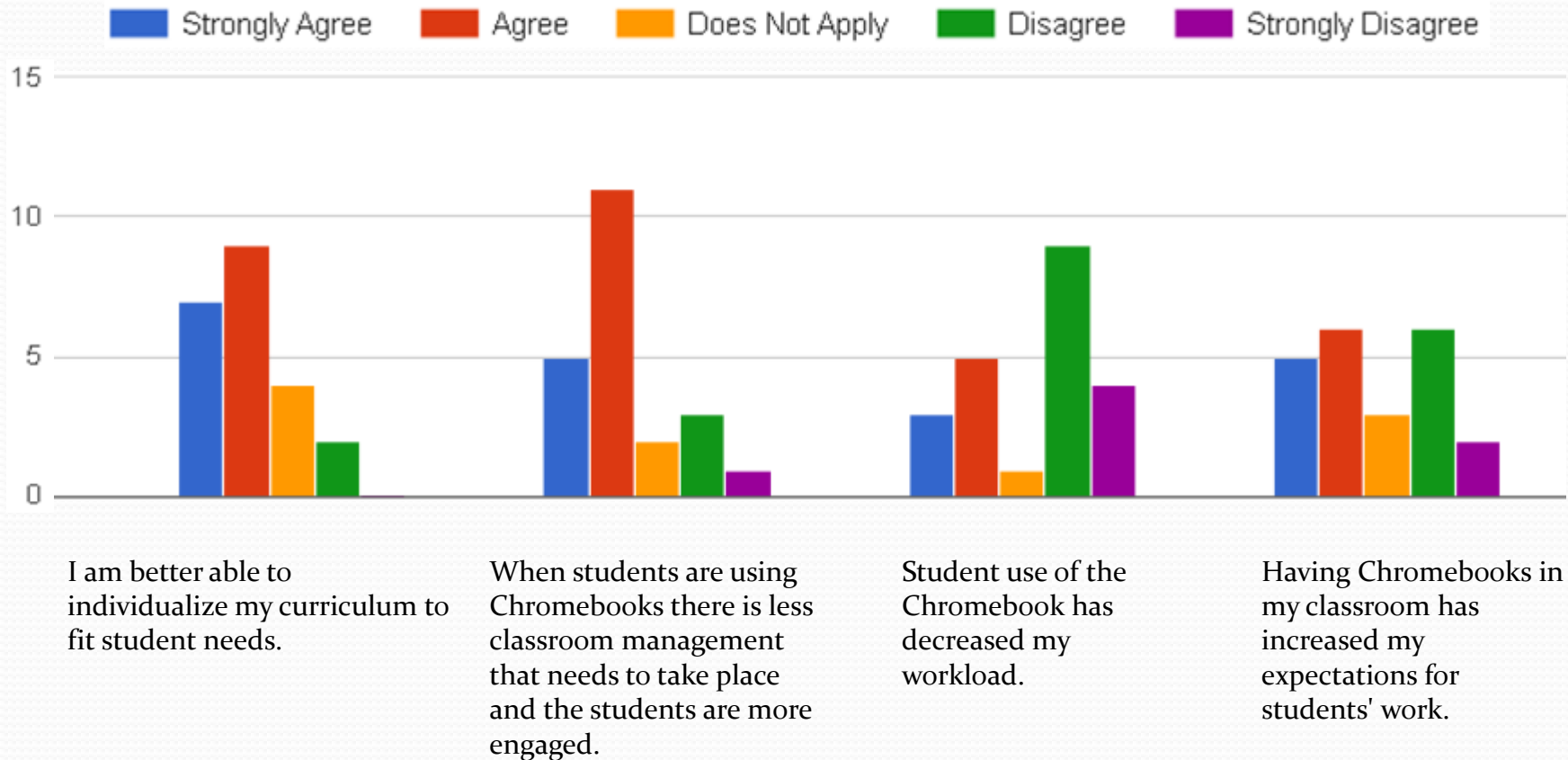
The Chromebook has helped me to become better organized with grading students' assignments on-time because I have easy access to their work.

The Chromebook helps to facilitates students' communication and collaboration with their peers.

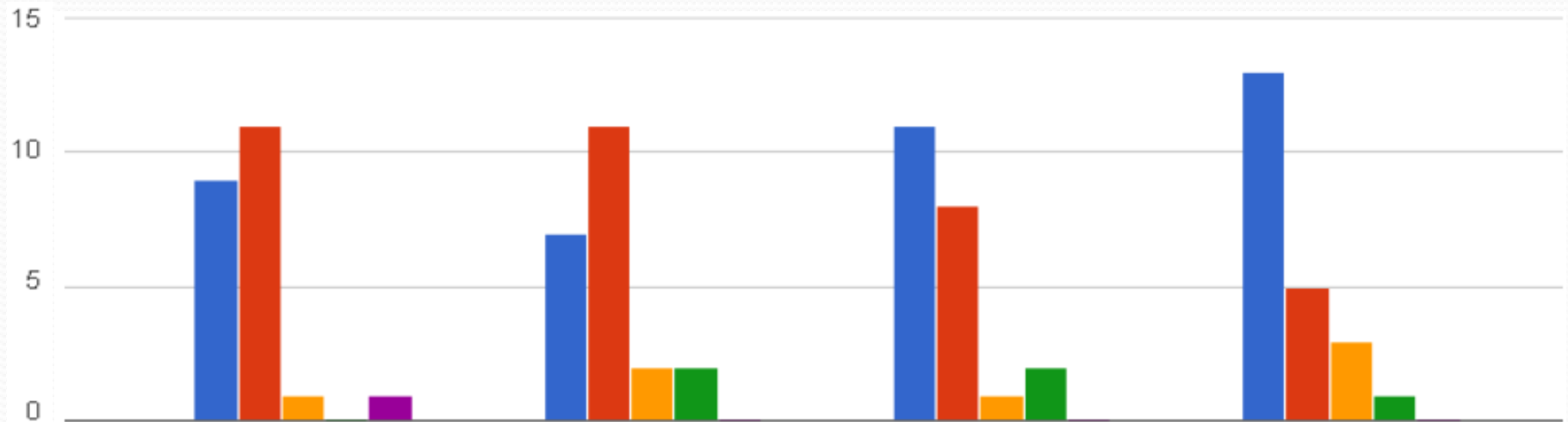
The Chromebook allows students to gain immediate access to the current lesson and expectations.

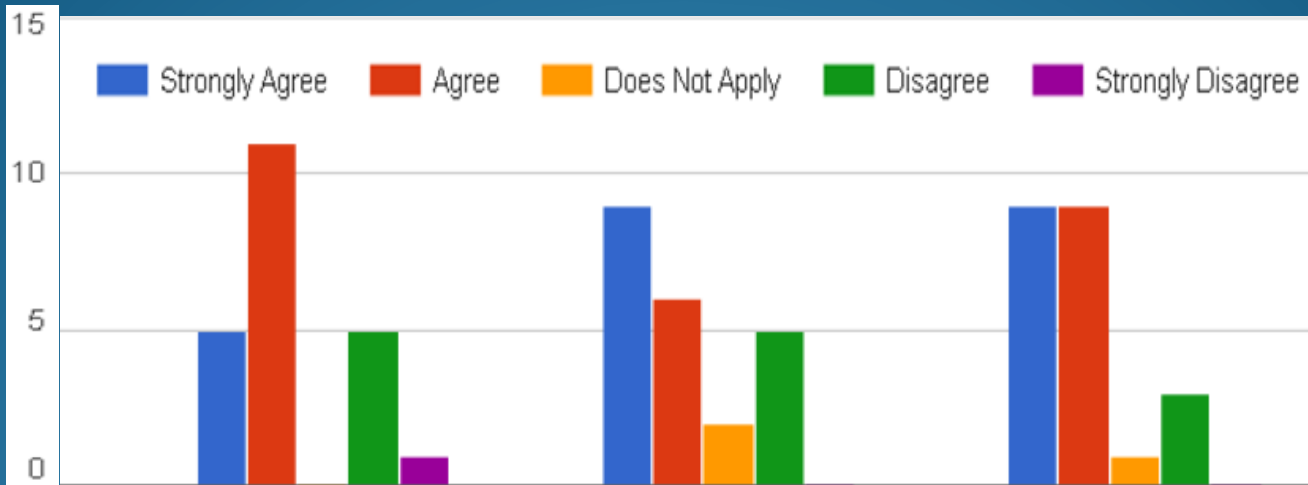
I have adequate access to technical support in my classroom.
